The senior girls had a great win in Beann Eadair GAA for their final game of the Cumann na mBunscoil season. Well done girls!



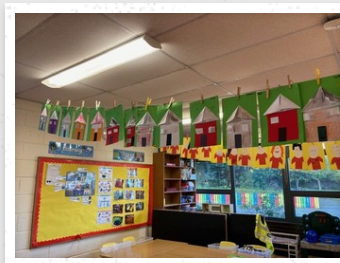
JUNIOR INFANTS

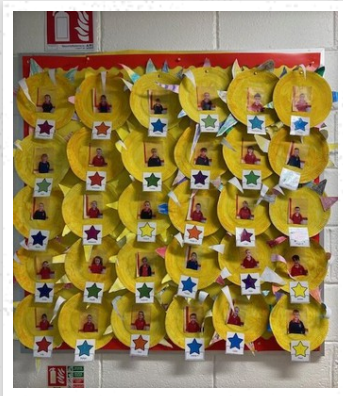

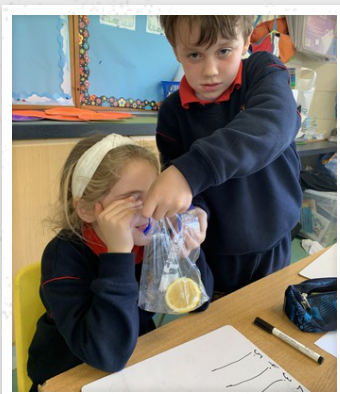




FIRST CLASS
